

Tuition & Costs

This past year, *The Princeton Review* ranked Truman as the 2nd Best Value in the nation for a public institution. You will find they are right. Our tuition costs make us very affordable for both in-state and out-of-state students. Here are our estimated costs.

Tuition (academic year)	\$6,210	\$10,820

*This is an estimated cost projection for a full-time, undergraduate student. Actual cost of Room and Board varies depending on which residence hall is selected. This example is for a student enrolled full-time, living in a two-person room in the Ryle or Centennial residence halls, and taking the 20-meal plan.
